uring the thirty-sixth week since the coup, fighting between the Burma Army (BA) and Kachin Independence Army (KIA) occurred in Hpakant and Danai, Kachin State. In other parts of the country, the BA clashed with Months Endowed Policy State. Additionally, clashes between the BA and the local People's Defence Forces (PDF) were reported in Magwe, Sagaing, and Tanintharyi regions. This week, violence against regime informants and collaborators, and regime-related offices and assets was reported in Httgyaint, Loikaw, Mandalay, Putao, Paing-kyone, Salingyi, Waw, Maubin, Kawmu, Momauk, and Myaing. In the meantime, the Covid-19 virus and natural disaster continues to pose serious challenges for the people of Burma.

Humanitarian Crisis and Human Rights Violations

- On October 2 in Ye Township, Mon State, the security forces arrested the 94-year old mother of a former NLD lawmaker, U Myo Win. The mother was later released but his daughter who was arrested in the same incident is still being detained.
- Nearly 1,000 villagers in Thayetchaung Township, Tanintharyi Region, have been displaced by fighting between the BA and PDF.
- Over the weekend of October 2-3, in Htein Law Village, Gangaw Township, Magwe Region, the <u>BA troops burned multiple houses</u>. Villagers also found an unidentified burned body in one of the houses.
- On October 3 in Myittha Township, Mandalay Region, three civilian pedestrians were arrested after a bomb exploded at a local office Military Security Affairs.
- On October 3 in Dadeye Township, Ayeyarwaddy Region, <u>about</u> 30 locals were arrested after a bomb exploded near the town welcome sign.
- On October 3 in Naypyitaw, the security forces <u>arrested a student</u> <u>union leader</u>, Tun Aung Kyaw (age 15), in Zabuthiri Township.
- On October 5, in Kyone Pyaw Village, Ayeyarwaddy Region, <u>the coup regime's troops forcibly arrested a buddhist nun</u> at her monastery.
- On October 5 in Mogok Township, Mandalay Region, the security forces <u>arrested two civilians and asked their families 500,000</u> <u>kyats</u> (approximately USD 350) for their release.
- On October 5 in Myingyan Township, Mandalay Region, the security forces <u>arrested four civilians in place of their family</u> <u>members.</u> Mya Shin, a 50-year old lady, was beaten and arrested

Violence in Magwe and Sagaing Regions

- On October 4 and 5 in Pale Township, Sagaing Region, the BA soldiers set fires to multiple houses in two villages in the region.
- On October 5 in Gangaw
 Township, Magwe Region, the coup regime's troops <u>raided</u> and set fires to Kyundat Village, burning at least five residential homes.
- On October 7 in Chaung-U
 Township, Sagaing Region, the BA soldiers shot and killed a civilian.
- On October 7 in Myaung
 Township, Sagaing Region,
 the security forces arrested 5
 monks for alleged connections
 with the PDF. In the same
 township, the BA set fires to
 multiple residential homes in
 Mindan Village forcing locals to
 flee. The soldiers also shot and
 killed three locals.
- On October 7 in Ye-U Township, Sagaing Region, the BA soldiers shot and killed two villagers

- because she stalled time and allowed her son to escape.
- On October 5 in Ngan-zun Township, Mandalay Region, the BA soldiers arrested 7 civilians including a monk.
- On October 6 in Loikaw Township, Karenni State, <u>random shootings</u> from the BA killed a 50-year old man and injured eight other civilians including two children.
- On October 7 in Hpakant Township, Kachin State, the BA soldiers shot a civilian after mistakenly assuming that he set off explosives at them.

Other Updates

- More than 76,000 children in Burma have been forced to flee their homes since February. A global charity Save the Children warned that a large proportion of the displaced children could go hungry as their families share a single meal per day.
- <u>Civil society organisations Sagaing Region estimate that around</u> 100,000 people in the area have been displaced by BA attacks and fighting with resistance forces.
- Burma's <u>farmers are making losses</u> as the prices of fertilizers and other agricultural inputs have doubled during the monsoon season.
- Burma <u>will receive over 6 million COVID vaccine</u> doses through a global health partnership GAVI.

- in Taung-byin-nge Village for the possession of homemade guns.
- On October 7 and 8 in
 Htigyaing Township, Sagaing
 Region, 13 civilians including
 three 15-year olds were
 arrested by the regime forces
 after two abandoned police
 outposts in the area were
 burned down by resistance
 fighters. Zaw Myo Tun, who
 was arrested for alleged
 connections with PDF, was
 reported to be dead a few
 hours later.
- On October 8 in Kale
 Township, Sagaing Region,
 the security forces set fires to
 multiple houses in Tharyarkone
 Village, and arrested three
 civilians.
